VOCATIONAL COURSES EXPLAINED

WHAT IS A STUDY PROGRAMME?

A study programme will be designed specifically for you and will include four main elements:

- · Your main vocational course
- Development of employability skills (including work experience)
- · Personal and professional development
- · English and maths.

In order to gain your overall qualification, you must pass all four elements of your study programme.

WHAT IS A VOCATIONAL COURSE?

Vocational courses provide a more practical, real-world approach to learning, combining theory with practical work. They are developed with employers and higher education experts to ensure learners will have skills which employers are looking for.

The majority of vocational courses are assessed throughout the course by way of coursework.

VOCATIONAL COURSE OR A-LEVELS?

The main difference between vocational and A-Levels is that A-Levels are assessed by examinations at the end of the course and are sometimes combined with coursework. However, vocational courses are mostly coursework based with some practical assessments and work experience, ideal for those who feel pressurised by exams.

Vocational students can be better prepared for university study due to the portfolio based nature of the courses, the real-life practicals and work placements undertaken.

CAN I STILL GO TO

Yes, many of our students have progressed from Level 3 vocational courses onto degree courses at university.

Vocational qualifications are held in high esteem by colleges, universities and employers. Most are recognised by universities for entry onto many degree level courses, for example, a student achieving a triple distinction on a BTEC Level 3 course will amass 360 UCAS points, equivalent to achieving 3 As at A-Level.

As with A-Levels, the vocational course you study won't necessarily dictate the subject you study at university - there are many transferable choices in terms of subjects.

FULL TIME STUDY OR APPRENTICESHIP?

Apprenticeships are ideal if you prefer less time in the classroom and more practical onthe-job training. You will learn up-to-date skills, while achieving recognised qualifications and earning a salary. If you'd like to do an apprenticeship but don't have the necessary experience or skills, you can undertake a traineeship first. Apprenticeships can also be an alternative route into higher education and are now being offered at levels 4, 5 and 6.

Please note: Some subjects may require higher grades in specific GCSEs and some vocational areas may require you to start at Level 1 regardless of grades, due to the new skills you will need to learn.

If you join us without a grade 4 or above in English language or mathematics you will working towards this as part of your course.

GCSE RETAKES

GCSE English Language

The course covers the GCSE English syllabus in preparation for Paper A (Explorations in creative reading & writing) and Paper B (Writers' viewpoints and perspectives).

Entry Requirements: Grade 3 in GCSE English Language. Grades lower than 3 will study Functional Skills English up to Level 1 before progressing to this course

GCSE Mathematics

The course follows the Edexcel (Pearson) GCSE Mathematics syllabus at Foundation Level and consists of exam skills preparation for 3 exams.

Entry Requirements: Grade 3 in GCSE Mathematics. Grades lower than 3 will study Functional Skills Maths up to Level 1 before progressing to this course.

APPLIED SCIENCE

Weybridge Campus



Level 2 Diploma in Applied Science

The course develops skills, knowledge and understanding of 'How Science Works' through practical activities such as: planning to test a scientific idea, collection and analysis of scientific data and working safely with others. You will study current science issues through investigations using numerical data and using ICT to produce reports.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Forensic Science

Level 3 Subsidiary or 90 Credit Diploma in Forensic Science

This course follows a vocational model designed to prepare students for the technical and rewarding work in the forensic science, criminological and science related industries. Students follow a range of units including: fundamentals of science; forensic investigation; criminal psychology and aspects of law.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Forensic Science

Level 3 National Diploma or Extended Diploma in Forensics

After the successful completion of year 1, students have the option to continue on to the National Diploma (equivalent to 2 A-Levels) or the National Extended Diploma (equivalent to 3 A-Levels). Units may include: unlawful homicide and police powers; criminology; forensic photography and fire investigation.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Subsidiary or 90 Credit Diploma

Progression: Higher education or employment

ART & DESIGN

Weybridge Campus



Level 1 Diploma in Art, Design & Media

This is a practical course which enables you to build and develop a range of art and design skills. You will have the opportunity to undertake a carousel of activities in art, design and media before deciding on your preferred specialist pathway, either art and design or media.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: GCSE passes grade 3 1
- Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Art & Design or Creative Media Production

Level 2 Diploma in Art & Design

This is a practical course with workshop sessions which will introduce you to materials, processes and technical skills that underpin graphic design and packaging, animation and digital methods of production, surface pattern design, fashion design, 3D and product design, architecture design, drawing and painting, illustration and contextual research.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes (including 1 GCSE at grade 4 or above ideally in an art related subject)
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma & Extended Diploma in Art & Design

Level 3 Diploma and Extended Diploma in Art & Design

Workshops are delivered in architectural design, graphic and concept design, animation and digital methods of production, 3D, product and packaging design, photography, surface pattern design, fashion, interior design, illustration, drawing, painting, printmaking and critical and contextual awareness.

- Length: Diploma 1 year, Extended Diploma 2 years
- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above (ideally including English and Maths, and Art & Design at grade 6 or above).
- Progression: Higher education or employment

BEAUTY THERAPY

Ashford & Weybridge Campus





Level 1 Diploma in Hairdressing & Beauty Therapy (Ashford or Weybridge)

This course includes basic facials, basic manicure, basic pedicure, preparation of the work area for level 2 treatments and basic anatomy and physiology, you will also be assessed on a small number of hairdressing units such as blow-drying, shampooing, plaiting and twisting hair.

(a) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy

Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy (Ashford or Weybridge)

Study will include facials, manicure, pedicure, waxing, lash and brow treatments, make-up and related anatomy and physiology.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 2 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Beauty Therapy

Level 3 Diploma in Beauty Therapy (Ashford)

Study includes: body massage, Indian head massage, hot stone massage, electrical facial treatments and pre-blended aromatherapy. You will also be expected to develop your commercial skills.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Diploma in Theatrical, Special Effects, Hair & Media Make-up (Weybridge)

This course is designed for learners who would like to work as a make-up and hair stylist within the fashion, theatre, TV & film industry. The programme is designed to teach a range of practical skills with both make-up and hair. You will need to be committed and focussed, as this programme is very intense and fast paced, and be able to promote yourself within networking groups. Units can include: basic airbrush skills, media make-up, fashion & photographic make-up, how to apply basic prosthetics and creative hair styling.

(4) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at /grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Level 4 HNC in Production Media Make-Up (Weybridge)

This intensive part-time higher education course enables you to develop awareness of the media industry, learn the technical skills required to work as a specialist hair and make-up artist and build a professional portfolio. The course includes practical sessions and theory through business and production management and focuses on working in the media industries of fashion and live performance, including aspects of the film and television industry. You will study current trends in make-up and editorial hair, character theatre make-up, body painting and special effects.

Length: 1 year (2 days per week)

Entry Requirements: At least 1 A-level or Level 3 qualification in an industry related course

Progression: Higher education or employment

BUSINESS

Ashford Campus & Weybridge Campus



Level 2 Diploma in Business (Ashford)

This course will give you an introduction to the skills and knowledge required for all types of work in business. All the units studied will have a real life business focus. Units may include: introduction to business activity, investigating financial control, business enterprise and sales, customer service and how to market and promote your product/service.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Business

Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Business / 90 Diploma in Business (Ashford or Weybridge)

This course will give you an excellent grounding in the vocational skills and knowledge required for all types of work in the business environment. All the units will have a real life business focus. You will also have the opportunity to represent the college by participating in business events, propertitions and trips.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, including English and Maths and ideally 1 GCSE

at grade 5

Progression: Level 3 Extended Diploma in Business

Level 3 Extended Diploma in Business (Ashford or Weybridge)

This course continues on from the 90 credit Diploma in Business and will give you an even wider skill set. It is equivalent to 3 A-levels which will give the opportunity to progress onto University. Units may include: visual merchandising, business project management, contract law, priness events, market research and relationship marketing.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Diploma

Progression: Higher education or employment.

Level 1 Diploma in Introduction to Professional Cookery

This is an introduction to the basic skills required to work as a professional chef in the industry. You will first study simple concepts and prepare simple plates that will become progressively more inspiring as you learn.

4 Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Professional Cookery

Level 2 Diploma in Professional Cookery

This course provides the skills required to work as a chef within the industry. You will be working in groups with specialist tutors who will further develop your skills in cooking and preparation. You will also develop a variety of food service techniques as required by industry.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Professional Cookery

Level 3 Diploma in Professional Cookery

This course builds on knowledge gained at level 2 or is suitable for those with relevant work experience, wishing to progress onto a more complex level. You can study either patisserie or kitchen and larder skills.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 2 qualification in an industry related course



CHILD STUDIES

Ashford Campus & Weybridge Campus



Level 1

Diploma in Introduction to Health, Social Care & Children & Young People's Settings (Weybridge)

This course will develop your knowledge of working in health, social care and young people's settings. It is about exploring new ideas and effective communication.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Certificate in an Introduction to Early Years Education and Care or Level 2 First Extended Certificate in Health & Social Care

Level 2 Certificate in an Introduction to Early Years Education and Care (Ashford or Weybridge)

The course provides valuable knowledge through themed taught lessons. Some of the topics covered include: supporting physical care routines, understanding legislation, and planning to meet the needs of the developing child.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above in English Language

Progression: Level 3 Certificate/Diploma in Childcare and Education (Early Years Educator)

Level 3 Certificate/Diploma in Childcare and Education (Early Years Educator) (Ashford or Weybridge)

This qualification is designed to help learners build the knowledge and skills needed when working with children and young people from birth to 7 years through themed taught lessons. Units you will cover include child development, play and learning, safeguarding children, understanding children's additional needs and many other interesting topics.

Length: 2 years

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, including English and Maths

Progression: Higher education or employment.

HIGHER EDUCATION:

Foundation Degree in Early Years (Weybridge)

This course is for those who are currently working in an early years setting and want to gain a qualification that will help professional progression.

Foundation Degree in Children's Special Educational Needs and Inclusive Practice (Weybridge)

This course is for those who are currently working with children who have additional learning needs in the Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 or Key Stage 2.

COMPUTING

Weybridge Campus



Level 1 Diploma for IT Users (Weybridge)

If you are interested in IT, this course will provide you with the skills and knowledge valued by employers in the IT industry. Units include IT user fundamentals, databases, spreadsheets, using mobile devices, desktop publishing, drawing and planning, web design, multimedia and others.

(4) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Technical Diploma in IT

Level 2

Technical Diploma in IT including Games Development (Ashford or Weybridge)

This course comprises 7 units and combines practical work on computers and theory lessons. Units include communicating in the IT industry, working in the IT industry, website development, computer graphics, computer systems, developing computer games and spreadsheet modelling.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 or above

Progression: Level 3 Subsidiary/Diploma/Extended Diploma in IT

Level 3 Subsidiary/Diploma/Extended Diploma in IT including Games Development (Weybridge)

Students take several core units and then can follow one of the specialised routes in Business or IT Systems. Business units include e-commerce, website production and management and organisational systems security. IT Systems units include principles of software design and development, event driven programming and computer games design.

Length: 2 years

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Higher education or employment

CONSTRUCTION

Ashford & Weybridge Campus





Level 1 Award in Carpentry and Bricklaying (Weybridge)

This course is primarily about preparing you for working in the construction industry. The main focus of the course is practical application of construction skills and methods of work. You will gain confidence in using maths and literacy, along with learning valuable skills in brickwork and carpentry, which will enable you to progress on to a specialist trade path.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 1 Diploma in Brickwork or Carpentry

Level 1 Diploma in Bricklaying (Weybridge)

This course helps to prepare you to work safely and with confidence in the construction industry, with a focus on bricklaying and block work construction skills. Examples of units covered include: knowledge of construction technology, constructing block walling, brick walling and cavity walling, and setting out basic masonry structures.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Bricklaying or apprenticeship

Level 1 Diploma in Carpentry and Joinery (Weybridge)

This course helps to prepare you to work safely and with confidence in the construction industry, with a focus on carpentry and joinery construction skills. Examples of units covered include: knowledge of construction technology, producing woodworking joints, maintaining and using carpentry and joinery hand tools, preparing and using carpentry and joinery portable power tools.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Site Carpentry or apprenticeship

Tyler who started out on the Level 1 course, worked his way through the levels and landed a job and apprenticeship with the UK's largest brickwork contractor, Lee Marley Brickwork.

Level 2 Diploma in Bricklaying (Weybridge)

You will learn new masonry, block work and brickwork skills as well as developing those learnt at level 1. Examples of units covered include: setting out masonry structures, constructing solid walling incorporating isolated and attached piers, constructing cavity walling and forming masonry structures.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: Level 1 Diploma in Bricklaying
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Brickwork or apprenticeship

Level 2 Diploma in Site Carpentry (Weybridge)

You will learn new site carpentry skills as well as developing those learnt at level 1. Examples of units covered include: preparing and using carpentry and joinery portable power tools, carrying out first and second fixing operations, and carrying out structural carcassing operations.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: Level 1 Diploma in Carpentry
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Site Carpentry or apprenticeship

Level 2 Electrical Installation (Ashford)

This course is the first step of your training to become a qualified electrician, providing you with the basic skills and experience needed in the industry. The qualification covers many areas within electro technical technology, examples of units covered include: principles of electrical science, electrical installation technology, installation of wiring systems and enclosures.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 4 or above in maths and English
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Electrical Installation



CONSTRUCTION

Level 3 Diploma in Bricklaying (Weybridge)

You will learn new brickwork skills as well as developing those learnt at level 2. Examples of units covered include: analysing the construction industry and built environment, repairing and maintaining masonry structures, constructing chimneys and fireplace structures, constructing complex masonry structures and decorative features.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 2 Diploma in Bricklaying

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Diploma in Site Carpentry (Weybridge)

You will learn new site carpentry skills as well as developing those learnt at level 2. Examples of units covered include: setting up and operating cutting and shaping machinery, erecting complex structural carcassing components, installing and maintaining non-structural and structural components.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 2 Diploma in Carpentry

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Electrical Installation (Ashford)

This course builds on the skills learnt at level 2. The qualification covers many areas within electro technical technology, examples of units covered include: principles of electrical science, electrical installations technology, installation of wiring systems and enclosures, and understanding how to communicate with others within building services engineering.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 2 Electrical Installation

Progression: Higher education or employment



Level 3 Extended Diploma in Construction and the Built Environment (Weybridge)

This course aims to provide a stepping stone to Higher Education or the Professional side of the construction industry such as project management, architecture or surveying. Examples of units covered include: construction principles, design and technology, health & safety in construction, building regulations and control, management of a construction project, and measurement techniques.

- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes grade 4 or above (including English and maths)
- Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 1 Certificate in Engineering

With an emphasis on practical study in our outstanding manufacturing workshops, this course will provide you with the knowledge and skills to be able to carry out basic manufacturing processes including, fabrication, sheet metal work, lathe operation and welding.

(1) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Engineering - Manufacturing Technology

Level 1 Certificate and Diploma in Vehicle Maintenance

This is a very thorough motor vehicle course designed to give you an awareness of all the major operating systems of a light motor vehicle. You will develop a clear understanding of the maintenance procedures required to maintain the systems and will work on a range of vehicles in our outstanding motor vehicle workshops to hone your skills.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair Principles.

Level 2 Core Engineering

Engineering has many different subject areas, and if you're undecided which area you want to study, then this course is right for you. It will build your practical skills and introduce you to aeronautical, manufacturing and motor vehicle engineering.

(1) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Manufacturing Engineering, Aeronautical Engineering or Vehicle Technology (Motorsport)

Level 2 Diploma in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair Principles

This course is designed for students who want to develop practical skills in, and broaden their understanding of, motor vehicle systems. You will work to recognised industry standards and obtain the underpinning knowledge and skills to prepare you for a career in this industry.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Vehicle Technology (Motorsport)

Level 2 Diploma in Engineering - Manufacturing Technology

This course will develop your skills further in milling, turning, fabrication and welding. Units may include: principles of manufacturing technology, machine components using milling and turning techniques and fabricating sheet metal work.

(4) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Manufacturing Engineering





ENGINEERING

Level 2 Diploma in Electrical and Electronic Engineering Technology

This course covers the knowledge and understanding of the principles, methods and technology involved in electrical and electronic engineering. You will gain understanding of and the skills required for the electronic industry. Course units may include: engineering principles, techniques and environment, applied electrical and mechanical science for engineering technicians, electronic devices and communication applications, using computer aided drawing techniques, operational and maintenance of electronic systems and components and electronic circuit construction.


- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Electrical and Electronic Engineering Technology

Level 3 Diploma in Electrical and Electronic Engineering Technology

An example of units that may be studied include: engineering and environmental health and safety, engineering organisational efficiency and improvement, electrical and electronic principles, advanced mathematics, advanced electrical and electronic principles, advanced engineering science, programmable logic controllers, analogue electronics, digital electronics, and panel wiring for engineering applications.

- (4) Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English, Science and or Physics, and also Maths at grade 3.
- Progression: Higher education or employment









Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Aeronautical Engineering

This qualification is designed to give you an introduction to the broad range of analytical skills required by an Aeronautical Engineering Technician. You will spend time developing skills and knowledge through a balance of theory and practical lessons, during which you will learn about the theory of flight and aircraft maintenance practices.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade C/grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Aeronautical Engineering

Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Aeronautical Engineering

This course looks to provide you with specialised skills and knowledge in aircraft materials and hardware, hydraulics, propulsion, airframes, avionics and more.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Aeronautical Engineering

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Subsidiary/Diploma/Extended Diploma in Manufacturing Engineering

This course looks to provide you with specialised skills and knowledge in engineering project management, CNC machining, CAM processes, engineering materials, electronics and will further develop your welding ability.

Length: 2 years

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Subsidiary/Diploma/Extended Diploma in Vehicle Technology (Motorsport)

This course will provide you with specialised skills and knowledge in fault rectification and diagnostics, engineering design, motorsport preparation and inspection, as well as many more exciting areas of motor vehicle and motorsport engineering.

Length: 2 years

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 4/5 FdEng in Motorsport Engineering (Oxford Brookes)

This course is primarily for people who are currently working in a related field who wish to gain a higher level qualification in recognition of their skills and knowledge or who would like to build on existing expertise. We have extensive employer links which allow for the course to be tailored to meet industry needs and current practice.

Length: 2 years (3 days per week) or 3 years (2 evenings per week)

Entry Requirements: Level 3 Diploma in Engineering, A-Levels or Access to HE qualification

Progression: BSc (Hons) Motorsport Technology top up year

Level 6 BSc (Hons) Degree in Motorsport Technology (Oxford Brookes)

This course is aimed at people who are interested in the technical aspects of motorsport engineering and in computer aided design for racing cars. You will have access to excellent facilities, including 2 wheel chassis dyno, engine dyno, composites workshop and CNC and fabrications workshops.

You will need to be committed and focussed as this programme is very intense and fast paced and to be able to promote yourself within networking groups. Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at /grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: HNC in Production Media Make-Up



Level 4 HNC in Production Media Make-Up (Weybridge)

This intensive part-time higher education course enables you to develop awareness of the media industry, learn the technical skills required to work as a specialist hair and make-up artist and build a professional portfolio. The course includes practical sessions and theory through business and production management and focuses on working in the media industries of fashion and live performance, including aspects of the film and television industry. You will study current trends in make-up and editorial hair, character theatre make-up, body painting and special effects.

Length: 1 year (2 days per week)

Entry Requirements: At least 1 A-level or Level 3 qualification in an industry related course

Progression: Higher education or employment

HEAD START (ESOL with Integrated Studies)

Weybridge Campus



ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) is taught using a variety of stimulating materials and experiences to promote language development. The course includes ESOL, Maths and IT. It recognises and embraces the richness and cultural diversity of the range of students. Each learner is supported on their journey of development with a strong pastoral focus.

We encourage integration with other areas in the College for example sport, survival skills, bushcraft, first aid. We also offer the chance of taster sessions in a range of areas including Catering, Media, Health & Social Care, Construction and Engineering. As a result many of the students have gone on to study in these areas as full time vocational students having completed Headstart.

We also promote and encourage links with local community organisations. We invite a number of professional people to come in to develop certain skills. This year has seen professional photographers and musicians working with the learners in our Performance Suite which was a great success.

Trips are also undertaken and so far have included Brooklands Museum and Hampton Court Palace – more are planned for next year.

PUBLIC SERVICES

Weybridge Campus





Level 1 Preparation for Sport and Uniformed Public Services

This course aims to provide students with a basic understanding of employment in the sport, leisure and uniformed public services industries. Students will study a range of units such as: working in a team, how the body works and introduction to security, volunteering and planning.

(1) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Sport or Uniformed Public Services

Level 2 First Diploma in Uniformed Public Services

This course will develop the skills and knowledge desired by employers in any of the uniformed public services. It re-enforces teamwork, leadership skills and communication whilst preparing you for the work environment. You will study: crime and effects, responding to emergencies, public service fitness and the role and work of the public services.

(4) Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Uniformed Public Services.

Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Uniformed Public Services

This course will enhance your employability skills and knowledge desired by the uniformed public services e.g. the Armed Forces or the Emergency Services. The emphasis at this level is on self-discipline, teamwork and leadership which are vital for any of the uniformed public services.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Uniformed Public Services.

Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Uniformed Public Services

This course will follow on from the Subsidiary Diploma giving learners further in-sight into varied aspects of the Emergency Services and Armed Forces helping to further develop essential skills and knowledge. Some of the units you will study are: international organisations and human rights, land navigation by map and compass, understanding the impact of war, conflict and terrorism on public services, employment, current and media affairs, fitness testing and training.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Uniformed Public Services

Progression: HNC/D in Policing and Uniformed Services

Level 4 /5 HNC/D in Policing and Uniformed Services

By 2020, all new entrants to the police force must be qualified to degree level. The new BTEC Higher Nationals in Policing will enable qualification holders to top up to a BA Hons Degree in Policing or related subject area or enter employment as a special constable, police volunteer or police staff (civilian roles). This course is ideal for those wanting a career in policing but will also be useful for those wanting to enter other public sector organisations as an officer (e.g military police, border force, prison service or other uniformed and non-uniformed services).

Length: 1 year (2 days per week)

Entry Requirements: Level 3 course (e.g. BTEC National or A-levels) and GCSE English and maths at grade 4. You will need to apply through UCAS for this course.

Progression: Higher education or employment

SEND & TRANSITION

Weybridge Campus



The Vickers Centre is for learners with Autism and/or Speech, Language and Communication needs. This centre provides a unique college based setting for students in Surrey. Learners will enjoy the security of a secure building in a quiet area of the college whilst having the opportunity to integrate into the wider college environment.

Vickers Centre facilities include:

- · Four standard classrooms
- · Domestic/catering kitchen
- · Craft/art room
- · Socialising/eating area
- · Horticulture facilities
- · Outdoor 'trim trail'
- · Ouiet rooms & break out areas

Work Experience:

Work experience is a valuable way of gaining employability skills. In the SEND and Transition Department we work with students, parents and Surrey Choices Employability to help you get the most out of your work placement.

The college offers 'Group Work Related Learning' (supported by Brooklands staff) for learners who need to develop the confidence and skills to undertake an independent work experience placement.

Residential Visit:

The SEND and Transition Department offers a yearly residential to the Outside Education Centre, High Ashurst. Learners have the opportunity camp in a tee-pee village for four nights and participate in land-based activities. This caters for all ages and abilities.

Transition:

Brooklands College has specially designed courses for students in transition between school/Entry Level provision and employment. The courses offer opportunities for learners to gain qualifications in employability skills and vocational experience in areas such as Art & Media, Hair & Beauty, Care, Carpentry, Catering, Engineering, IT, Sport & Public Services. Motor Vehicle and Travel & Tourism.

Learning for Life and Living

Entry Level 1 - Personal Progress:

This course aims to personalise units of study to students' life skills needs at Entry Level 1. You will learn skills in: independent living, looking after yourself and your home, household shopping, using money, leading a healthy lifestyle, making choices, using domestic appliances and community awareness.

Entry Level 2 - Foundations for Life:

This course aims to personalise units of study to students' life skills needs at Entry Level 2. You will develop skills in: independent living, household shopping, using money, making simple meals and community awareness, and personal care & hygiene.

Entry Level 3 - Promoting Independence:

This course is a learner centred course designed to enhance learners' independence and employability skills at Entry Level 3. You will develop skills in: living in the community, using public services - buses & trains, accessing financial services, accessing leisure services, applying for jobs & courses and undertaking an interview.

Learning for Employment and Progression

Entry Level 2 - Foundations for Employment:

This course offers a learner centred route into further independence and employment, at Entry Level 2. You will develop skills in: providing information in writing, using ICT, travel within the community, health & safety at work, working as part of a group, employability and applying for jobs & courses.

Entry Level 3 - Preparation for Employment:

This course provides students with the opportunity to experience a range of vocational sectors and learning experiences, at Entry Level 3. You will develop skills in: providing information in writing, community awareness, health & safety at work, working as part of a group, employability and applying for jobs & courses.



SEND & TRANSITION



Learning for Employment and Progression

Supported Internship

Entry Level 3 - Introduction to Employment:

This course involves a partnership with a local employer to enable students to develop employability skills at Entry Level 3 and with the opportunity to gain paid employment.. You will develop skills in: applying for a job, preparing for an interview, interview skills, preparing for work placement, introduction to health & safety at work, communication skills for work, producing a CV, developing personal presentation skills and learning from work placement.

Level 1 - Employability & Transition:

This course has been specially designed for students in transition between school/Entry Level provision and employment. The course offers opportunities for learners to gain Level 1 qualifications in employability skills and vocational experience.

This course is perfect if you are looking to gain a qualification and experience in a variety of subjects. Vocational areas may include Art & Media, Hair & Beauty, Care, Carpentry, Catering, Engineering, IT, Sport & Public Services, Motor Vehicle and Travel & Tourism.

Surrey Choices Employment Works for SEND (Supported Internships)

Level 1 Preparation for Sport and Uniformed Public Services

This course aims to provide students with a basic understanding of employment in the sport, leisure and uniformed public services industries. Students will study a range of units such as: working in a team, how the body works and introduction to security, volunteering and planning.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: GCSEs grade 3 - 1

Progression: Level 2 Diploma in Sport or Uniformed Public Services

Level 2 Technical Diploma for Sport and Activity Leadership

This course builds on the Level 1 Diploma in Sport and the GCSE in PE, improving the student's knowledge of fitness and sports performance. Examples of units covered include: coaching sport, working in sport and activity leadership, getting others active outdoors and delivering a sports activity event.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes including 1 GCSE at grade 4 and above

Progression: Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Sport - Development, Coaching & Fitness or Sport & Exercise Science

Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Sport - Development, Coaching & Fitness

The aim of the course is to develop an understanding of the human body and how it is affected by physical activity. Units include: health and safety factors involved in sports participation, the key principles involved in the coaching process, the fitness requirements and training methods needed for different sports as well as how to create fitness training programmes.

Length: 1 year

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and Maths

Progression: Level 3 Diploma in Sport

Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Sport & Exercise Science

Thia course will give you a solid foundation in the sport and active leisure sector. Units may include: sport and exercise physiology, anatomy for exercise and sport, sport and exercise psychology, practical team sports, exercise health and lifestyle, fitness testing for sport and exercise, and sports coaching.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, ideally including English and maths
- Progression: Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Sport & Exercise Science

Level 3 Diploma in Sport - Development, Coaching & Fitness

This course broadens and expands the knowledge and skills learnt from the Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma. Units may include: fitness training and programming, sports development, outdoor and adventurous activities, sports nutrition, instructing physical activity and exercise and sports injuries.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Sport Development, Coaching & Fitness
- Progression: Higher education or employment

Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma in Sport & Exercise Science

This course broadens and expands the knowledge and skills learnt from the Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma. Units may include: research methods for sport and exercise science, applied sport and exercise psychology, applied sport and exercise physiology, sports injuries, instructing physical activity, outdoor adventurous activities.

- Length: 1 year
- Entry Requirements: Level 3 Subsidiary/90 Credit Diploma in Sport & Exercise Science
- Progression: Higher education or employment

What is an apprenticeship?

It's a real job with real training, you will earn a wage whilst gaining a qualification.

How do they work?

This varies but often, apprentices will go to college for 1 day a week for off-the-job training and will spend 4 days a week in the workplace.

Some apprenticeships are based entirely in the workplace and your progress will be monitored both by your employer and coach who will visit you in the workplace.

Apprenticeships usually last a minimum of a year and can last up to 3 years.

How much will I get paid?

The minimum wage for apprentices is currently £3.70 per hour but many employers pay more than this. This will depend on what sector you are working in, region you live in and the level of your apprenticeship.




